ROBOCALL SCAMS

Don't let your phone expose you to insurance fraud.

Recognize

- Many robocalls lead to identity theft. Your data may then be used to submit fraudulent insurance claims.
- Robocalls are on the rise. Consumers who fall for scams may lose hundreds or thousands of dollars.
- Scams may promise @@VID-19 shots, tests and cures or expedited stimulus payments.



Protect



- **DON'T** answer unknown calls.
- DON'T accept unsolicited calls from alleged government agencies.
- DON'T provide sensitive data to unknown callers.
- **DO** verify who is calling.
- **DO** hang up and block suspicious callers.

Report

- Report the call to the <u>FTC</u> at <u>donotcall.gov.</u> Report the number on your caller ID and any number you're told to call back.
- <u>File a complaint</u> with the <u>FCC</u> if you believe you have received an illegal call or text, or if you think you're the victim of a spoofing scam.
