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2015 COIN CDFI Full Certification and Renewal Guidelines

CDFIs must be certified by COIN to participate in the COIN CDFI Tax Credit Program. All COIN Certified CDFIs must renew their certification annually and must be recertified every three years to maintain their COIN-certified status. The following table lists the required documents for full certification, recertification, and certification renewal.
