
QUALIFICATIONS, ASSUMPTIONS AND LIMITING CONDITIONS

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
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CALIFORNIA POPULATION DEMOGRAPHICS (1 OF 4)

CALIFORNIA POPULATION DEMOGRAPHICS (2 OF 4)





of adults in California have a mobility disability


This is defined as serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs



Percentage of population disabled¹ (individuals aged 18+)









¹ In this context, an individual is considered disabled if they report at least one of six disability types (hearing difficulty, vision difficulty, cognitive difficulty, ambulatory difficulty, and independent living difficulty) ² Captures a subset of rural counties in California; for this purpose, a county is defined as rural if its population density as of 2021 is less than or equal to 150 people/mi²



CALIFORNIA SENIOR (65+) POPULATION DEMOGRAPHICS (2 OF 2)








