Examination Scope	<p>In addition to evaluating the competitor's relative abilities as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, emphasis will also be on measuring competitively, relative to job demands, each competitor's :</p> <p>Knowledge of:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Insurance principles and actuarial science particularly with respect to life, health and disability insurance and the financial structure of various types of life and health insurance companies. <p>Ability to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Make complex and extensive actuarial and statistical computations.2. Appraise accurately from actuarial and statistical data the financial structure of life and health insurance companies examined.3. Prepare difficult and technical actuarial statistical reports and correspondence.4. Analyze situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action.
Testing Period	A candidate may be tested only once during any testing period. The testing period for this examination is 12 months.
Eligible List Information	<p>A departmental open eligible list will be established for the California Department of Insurance. Names of successful competitors will be merged into the list in order of final scores, regardless of date. Eligibility expires 12 months after it is established.</p> <p>Veterans preference points and Career Credits will not be granted in this examination.</p>

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Department of Insurance reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

For an examination without a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact the Department of Insurance, Human Resources Management Division, (916) 492-3300 three weeks after the final filing date if he/she has not received a progress notice.

Applications are available at the Department of Insurance offices, the State Personnel Board, local offices of the Employment Development Department, and on the internet at www.jobs.ca.gov.

If you meet the requirements stated on the reverse, you may take this examination. Your performance in this examination will be rated against a predetermined rating criteria. All competitors who pass will be ranked according to their scores. Meeting the entry requirements does not assure success in the examination or placement on the employment list.

Examination Locations: When a written test is part of the examination, it will be given in such places in California as the number of candidates and conditions warrant. Ordinarily, oral interviews are scheduled in Sacramento, San Francisco, and Los Angeles. However, locations of interviews may be limited or extended as conditions warrant.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, are used in the following order: 1) subdivisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, and 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on this bulletin.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others. Candidates must be in a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment of records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.
