Andaye Hill-Espinoza is the Southern California Regional liaison, and lead project manager for National Supplier Diversity, economic impact at Kaiser Permanente.

In her role, Andaye is responsible for leveraging Kaiser's non-clinical assets to create economic development in the communities where Kaiser has a footprint by contracting, and supporting diverse local businesses and entrepreneurship as a means to addressing the socio-economic determinants of health.

During her time at Kaiser, she has led the Chief Procurement Officer Summits which brought together the top CPO's of fortune 100 companies as well as, the CPO's from leading medical institutions and universities to agree upon a shared agenda, and how organizations can collectively utilize their purchasing power to drive economic impact in communities where it is needed most. In addition, she is a part of Kaiser's RECaF (Real Estate, Construction and, Facilities), and Total Health effort. Two strategic national economic impact initiatives that are changing how Kaiser Permanente builds, hire and purchases.

Prior to coming to Kaiser, Andaye served as Project Director for the community benefit department at Glendale Adventist Medical Center (GAMC). During her time there she successfully created, implemented, and led a city-wide cross collaborative strategic population health initiative in partnership between GAMC, USC Verdugo Hills Hospital and Health Center, Dignity Health, the City of Glendale, the Glendale Unified School District, and 52 other organizations. She likewise managed and served on the board of the Glendale Healthier Community Coalition; was a collaborator on the GAMC Community Health Needs Assessment, and previously held the role of project implementer for Choose Health LA Kids -a health and wellness program, funded by the LA County Department of Public Health and First 5 LA.

Andaye holds a M.A. in Applied Women's studies and M.P.H. in Community and Global Health from Claremont Graduate University. She received her Bachelor's degree from the City College of New York in Medical Anthropology. As a public health professional, Andaye's interests focus on the intersectionality of gender, culture, economics, and health. She served as a delegate for the U.N. Women's Conference in Beijing, China. Andaye worked at the ADVANCE Women's Program of U.S. Vets, a 40 bed safe and sober living facility for female veterans. There she created and implemented a health and wellness program for its residents. Andaye likewise served as the dignitary chair and co-coordinator of the

2013 female Stand Down, a community based intervention initiative designed to provide direct access to comprehensive services and referrals for at-risk and homeless female veterans.
