25	California Insurance Code section 1861.10 states in relevant part:		
26	(a) Any person may initiate or intervene in any proceeding		
27	permitted or established pursuant to this chapter, challenge any action of the commissioner under this article and enforce any		
28	provision of the article.		
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(b) The commissioner or a court shall award reasonable advocacy 1 and witness fees and expenses to any person who demonstrates 2 that (1) the person represents the interests of consumers, and (2)that he or she has made a substantial contribution to the 3 adoption of an order, regulation or decision by the Commissioner or a court. 5 6 CCR §2662.2 sets out the procedure by which intervenors are deemed 7 eligible to seek compensation: 8 (a) A person or group representing the interests of consumers 9 may provide to the Public Advisor a request for finding of eligibility to seek compensation. The request shall be verified 10 and may be verified by the intervenor's or participant's attorney and shall be submitted, at any time, in conjunction with an 11 ongoing proceeding in which the individual or organization seeks to intervene. The request shall comply with sections 2652.1-12 2652.4 of this subchapter and shall include: 13 (1) a showing by the intervenor or participant that it represents the interests of consumers, including a 14 description of the previous work of the intervenor or participant; and, 15 (2) in the case of groups representing the interests of 16 consumers, the request shall include the following as exhibits: 17 (A) a copy of the group's articles of 18 incorporation, by-laws, or (for groups not organized as corporations) other 19 organizational documents, 20 (B) if the group has members, the approximate number of current members, 21 (C) composition of the group's current Board 22 of Directors - including the name and business address of each director and/or the 23 name and business address of the principals of the group if it is not a corporation, 24 (D) newsletter circulation, if any, along with 25 a representative sample of newsletters and/or any other publication issued by the 26 intervenor in California during the previous twelve (12) months, 27 (E) any annual or year-end report for the 28 prior year, -3-

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2	(F) a statement as to whether or not the group has been granted non-profit status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c),			
3	and			
4	(G) in order to allow a determination whether the group actually does represent			
5	the interests of consumers, a listing, by general category, of the group's funding			
6 7	sources for the prior twenty-four (24) months and the approximate total percentage of the group's annual budget from each funding			
8	category. Each foundation, corporate, business, or government grant shall be			
9	separately listed by name of foundation, corporation, business, or government agency			
10	and amount of grant. For each individual who contributed at least five percent of the group's annual budget, the name of the			
11	individual and the total amount of the annual contribution shall be separately listed.			
12	The Public Advisor may require additional information			
13	The Public Advisor may require additional information regarding the request at any time, but not more than twice			
14	during any one calendar year from a given Intervenor or			
15	participant.			
16	CCR §2661.1 (j) defines representing the interests of consumers as follows:			
17	Represents the Interests of Consumers" means that the			
18	intervenor represents the interests of individual insurance			
19	purpose of consumer protection as demonstrated by, but is not limited to, a history of representing consumers in administrative,			
20	legislative or judicial proceedings.			
21	A party which represents, in whole or in part, any entity regulated by the Commissioner shall not be eligible for

27	the request for completeness. If the request includes all of the information required by subdivision (a) above, it is complete. If
