

## NOTICE OF YEAR-END REVIEW PROCEDURES

To: ALL ADMITTED INSURERS AND INTERESTED PERSONS

**Date: AUGUST 18, 2022** 

Subject: CORPORATE APPLICATIONS AND SIMILAR FILINGS REQUESTING

CDI APPROVAL BY YEAR-END 2022

Applicants seeking expedited review of corporate applications for completion by year-end 2022 must submit the applications no later than September 16, 2022, or, in the case of a Holding Company Act application, no later than October 14, 2022. Only perfected applications will be considered eligible for expedited review. A perfected application is one that is timely filed electronically via Oasis [https://interactive.web.insurance.ca.gov/OASIS/front] or submitted to CAB-SF-Intake@insurance.ca.gov and that includes:

- 1. An application form, if a form is required for the filing;
- 2. Payment of the required fee;
- 3. All supporting documents, in proposed final form;
- 4. A cover letter explaining the transaction, requesting year-end treatment and indicating that completion by year end is necessary to remedy a financial urgency, address a California market need or to coordinate approval with other state regulators.

CDI will make every effort to complete by year-end the review of perfected applications that conform to these procedures. The volume of applications submitted may require that applications be prioritized, which may preclude year-end review of some perfected applications. In most cases, applications for a Certificate of Authority or an Organizational Permit will not be eligible for year-end completion.

Material deficiencies identified during the review of an application must be cured no later than October 21, 2022, or, in the case of a holding company application, no later than November 18, 2022, to remain eligible for year-end approval. The presence of significant legal or financial issues in an application may preclude eligibility for expedited review or year-end consent.
