RE: Claims Processing for Pediatric COVID-19 Vaccination

The Department has been approached by providers and consumers regarding concerns that some insurers may not be ready to correctly process claims for pediatric COVID-19 vaccine administration.

The U.S. FDA and CDC have approved Pfizer-BioNTech's pediatric COVID-19 vaccine for children aged 5 to 11 years, a unanimous decision <u>confirmed</u> to Governor Gavin Newsom by the Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup. Due to the new dosage and age cohort, the American Medical Association has created CPT codes for vaccine and administration of pediatric doses of the COVID-19 vaccine developed by Pfizer. These codes are publicly available on the AMA's <u>website</u>, as well as from the <u>CMA Vaccine Toolkit</u>.¹

The Department directs health insurers to take necessary steps to update their claims processing systems for this newly eligible population, in light of the importance of expediting access to this next step in controlling the COVID-19 pandemic, and to avoid processing and administrative delays.
