NOTICE OF INVESTIGATORY HEARING PURSUANT TO CALIFORNIA INSURANCE CODE SECTION 12924 REGARDING THE PROPOSED MERGER OF AETNA INC. INTO CVS HEALTH CORPORATION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an investigatory hearing will be held regarding the proposed acquisition of Aetna Inc., a Connecticut Corporation ("Aetna") by CVS Pharmacy, Inc., a direct, wholly-owned subsidiary of CVS Health Corporation ("CVS"), in a reverse subsidiary merger. The hearing will be held as follows:

By virtue of the merger, CVS will acquire control and ownership of Aetna and 100% of its stock. Aetna Life Insurance Company, an Aetna subsidiary, is licensed to sell health insurance in California, and provides coverage to more than a million Californians.

The purpose of this hearing is to elicit testimony and comments regarding the possible implications of the proposed merger. Topics to be covered at the hearing include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1) The effect of the proposed merger on competition in the California health coverage market;
- 2) The effect of the proposed merger on consumer premiums and out-of-pocket health care costs;
- 3) The effect of the proposed merger on provider and facility network contracting and on consumer choice of, and access to, providers;
- The effect of the proposed merger on network design, including on the ability of consumers to continue to receive care from their current providers on an innetwork basis;
- 5) The efficiencies, if any, expected from the proposed merger, and their implications for the cost and quality of care delivered to consumers; and

6) The competitive effects of a vertical merger in the health insurance, retail pharmacy, and Pharmacy Benefit Manager (PBM) markets, including barriers to entry by competitors, elimination of Aetna as a potential PBM competitor, and effects on network and PBM service contracting by competitors, on competitor PBM data utilization, and on pharmaceutical costs borne by insurance consumers.

The Commissioner wishes to hear testimony from the parties to the acquisition, medical providers, consumers and other interested persons regarding the proposed merger. The hearing will be structured with priority given to witnesses who have made advance arrangements with, or who have been invited by, the Department to testify. Members of the public and other interested persons are encouraged to testify.

All written materials, written testimony and written comments, unless submitted at the hearing, must be <u>received</u> by the Insurance Commissioner <u>no later than 5:00 p.m. on</u> <u>Friday, June 22, 2018.</u> Written comments can be submitted one of two ways:
